10:35	<p>Why social justice is everyone’s business (Executive overview and panel discussion)</p> <p>A growing number of companies are thinking about their CSI more strategically and questioning the long-term impact of their efforts. In 2017, Trialogue’s inaugural research on CSI spend into the social justice and advocacy sector found that 11% of companies supported and less than 1% of CSI expenditure went to the sector.</p> <p>Conference sessions under this theme will explore whether companies should be compelled to help make the societies in which they operate more equitable and sustainable; some of the risks associated with supporting social justice work, and how these can be mitigated.</p>
